

# Resize an Image with Specific Dimensions in Affinity Photo 2 and Export for PDI Competition (and optionally add a stroke border)

#### 1. Open Your File

Launch Affinity Photo 2 and open the file you wish to export.

- 2. Adjust the Document's Dimensions (If Necessary)
  - o Go to **Document** > **Resize Document** in the top menu.
  - o In the dialog box that appears:
    - Ensure the **Maintain Aspect Ratio** option is enabled (the chain icon should be linked).
    - Set either the width to **1600 pixels** or the height to **1200 pixels**, depending on which is larger in your image.
      - (The other dimension will adjust automatically to maintain the aspect ratio.)
  - Click Resize.

### 3. Export as JPEG

- Go to File > Export or press Ctrl + Alt + Shift + S (Windows) or Cmd + Alt + Shift + S (Mac).
- o In the Export Settings dialog:
  - 1. **Choose JPEG** as the file format.
  - 2. Adjust the **Quality** slider to your preferred level (100% for maximum quality).
  - 3. Enable **Embed ICC Profile** for consistent colour reproduction.

#### 4. Set Export Dimensions

- Under the Export Settings on the right:
  - If you resized your document in Step 2, the dimensions should already match your requirement.
  - Double-check that the **Width** does not exceed **1600 px** and the **Height** does not exceed **1200 px**.
    - You can manually enter values if needed, ensuring the aspect ratio remains intact.
    - **Optional**: Use the lock icon to maintain aspect ratio during adjustments.

#### 5. Export the File

- o Click Export.
- o In the dialog that appears:
  - Choose a destination folder.
  - Name your file.
  - Click Save.

Your images will now be exported as JPEG files with a maximum width of 1600 pixels and a maximum height of 1200 pixels.

## Add a Stroke Border Using Layer Effects

- 1. **Open your image** in Affinity Photo 2.
- 2. In the Layers panel, make sure your image layer is selected.
- 3. At the bottom of the Layers panel, click the fx (Layer Effects) button.
- 4. In the Layer Effects dialog, check and enable **Outline**.
- 5. Adjust the options:
  - $\circ$  Colour  $\rightarrow$  pick your border colour.
  - $\circ$  Radius  $\rightarrow$  sets the thickness of the stroke.
  - o Position:
    - **Inside** → border stays inside the image edges.
- 6. Click **Close** when done your image now has a stroke border applied.
